Our Heart Statement

You may have noticed the statement Connecting

People with God and Each Other on the top of our documents. This statement reflects the heart of what we're about. We're a faith family in action! In all we do, we strive to help connect people with God, and deepen that connection through discipleship in Jesus Christ. We are so blessed as Christians to have God come to us in the person of Jesus of Nazareth. God wants to be known, and wants us to come together in that knowledge and love. God also wants us to participate in sharing this relationship with our community, helping others find their own connection with God; Jesus tell us we are 'salt' and 'light' to the world (Matthew 5:13-16). Fellowship at IBPC

What is fellowship?

Fellowship is the gathering of the people of God under the direction of God's Spirit. Our Worship at IBPC

What is worship?

Worship is about setting ourselves aside for glorifying God and celebrating creation. This is all the more important when our lives are filled with constant busyness. There is a graciousness and gratuity to worship; we renounce what we could be doing, set aside our own agenda and creatively enter God's story. We experience this in song or music, poetry, art or in the written word. In worship, God is the One who requires *all* of our being; our bodies, our minds and our hearts. This is why it's so important to gather together as the body of Christ, such as partaking in communion (the bread and wine) together.

Our Discipleship at IBPC

What is discipleship?

Christian faith is a journey. While it starts off with God accepting us just as we are, God wants us to move deeper in our identity as a disciple or follower of Jesus (discipleship development). As we journey with God, we belong less to ourselves, and more to Jesus and God's people; it's a process of giving up, but in return, receiving abundant life in Jesus (John 10:10). This journey enables us to become more 'salty' or transformative in God's world through how we live, what we say and what we do.

At IBPC:

- We actively disciple our children and youth and provide regular discipleship opportunities for everyone
- We value equipping people to share faith experiences
- We intentionally seek to share and connect our journeys and passions to help one another grow in Christ.

Our Social Justice at IBPC

What is social justice?

Since the birth of the Church, Christians have engaged in the realities of injustice, oppression, poverty and discrimination. God invites and commands us to be part of his redeeming work in God's world; to loosen the yoke and chains of those who share our flesh and blood. It is woven into our mission, and is also part of our evangelistic (good news) response. We stand in solidarity with those who are oppressed, imprisoned or locked in poverty, because God does (read Matthew 25:34-36). Where there are structures of oppression or evil, such as organisations that use child labour or sweat shop labour, terrorism or violence, Christians are called to be a light in the darkness.

At IBPC:

- We value being involved in people's work in social justice as part of the global church
- We seek to promote social justice issues even when it causes us discomfort.

Our Evangelism at IBPC

What is evangelism?

Evangelism is about witnessing to what God has done, what God is doing and what God will do. Jesus began his ministry on earth by asking people to 'Repent and believe the good news' (Mark 1:15). To repent in this context
